# Field trip with a Difference Thursday, 8th November

Taking up the invitation of the Rover Club of Auckland, I decided to go on their "Field Trip" to the Mainline Steam depot on Cheshire St, Parnell. As I was the only Mini Club member to show up, I felt rather embarrassed. But when I got there, I found probably close to a hundred people there from the other club marques, nearly all of which were British cars. We were divided into two groups and shown around the workshop area. Boy! Have they got some pretty heavy machinery in there. The buildings used to be the engine sheds of the old NZ Railways, so, I would think that they would have inherited much of the machinery in the workshop.

After the workshop tour, we went out into the engine shed. There were two mammoth machines there in the form of ex South African Railways engines, one of which was the Beyer-Garrett No. 4088, which cranks out an impressive 64,700 lbs of traction —more than double that of the 'K's; NZR's biggest engine. We were allowed to climb into the cabs of most of the engines there, which was very interesting. At the moment they are restoring Ja 1275 (a rather apt number, don't you think!) for mainline running. This engine was one of the last batch of 'J' class engines ever built and was a part of the batch built by North British in Glasgow between 1946 and 1956. This engine was built in 1951. She was stripped down pretty much and it is interesting to see how a steam locomotive is constructed and how they operate.

Our tour guide was a steam engine driver with NZR, and still drives for Mainline Steam, so he was very informative and able to answer the many questions that came his way. Many of the mechanics are volunteers, some of them quite young. They all have a passion for steam locomotives much the same as our passion for Minis. The biggest difference is just that! BIG! One young guy was changing wheel bearings on a bogie and the Timken taper roller bearings (SKF) were the same size as our Mini wheels. I would hate to pay the bill for that lot!

The other engines were Jb 1236, fully restored and presently being used on excursions, Ba 552, built in 1912 at Addington workshops, and used on the odd trip, Bb 144, built by A & G Price, of Thames in 1917, the Bagnall tank engine, a diesel shunter, and yet another J, no. 1240.

J 1240 has an interesting history. It was the first J class built at Hillside in Dunedin, (all the previous 'J's being built by North British) and was used to try out many experimental ideas It spent much of it's life in the South Island and ended it's days when sold to a guy in Blenheim in 1970. He transported the engine in pieces to his property with his Austin A40 pickup, reassembled it in front of his house and occasionally steamed it up. Of course the Marine Dept. got annoyed (and so did his neighbours) because it did not have a current boilers certificate and neither did the guy have a steam ticket. He actually had the thing jacked up so he could run the wheels — in mid-air. Eventually, it was sold to Ian Welch and it now awaits restoration.

I really appreciated the invite from the Rover Club and it is quite a departure to see how other enthusiasts of historic machinery such as steam engines, having a similar passion for their hobby as we do. It would be great to have another field trip of something else that may interest club members. Let the committee know if you are interested in seeing another mans hobby.
