BEST MOTORSPORT September 2005

Hi everyone. Sorry it's been so long since the last report. We have been doing a lot of upgrading, while rebuilding the front end. The one-piece front mould has been made and a new front section produced from it. We have secured it with Dzus fasteners for easy removal. A new front spoiler and undertray have been developed and fitted, along with new moulded winglets. We have fitted retaining tabs to the windscreen, to stop it from popping out at high speed as it was doing. The range of mechanical upgrades is as follows; Wilwood driver adjustable pedal box, Wilwood 4 pot alloy brake calipers, Toyota front race discs, alloy rear caliper mounts, Rose jointed steering ends, new improved front suspension arms, coil-over rear suspension, adjustable rear swaybar, handbrake replaced with electronic line-lock, new repositioned radiator, relocation of oil cooler, new FIA Sparco 5 point seatbelts. All of this has contributed to a significant weight saving. We have also revised and adopted new suspension geometry, spring settings, shock settings and brake ratio. This all resulted in a promising performance improvement on our first test day. Ben turned in lap times at Pukekohe in the 1:06 region. With more sorting and fine-tuning of the set-up, we believe we'll see 1:05's and better. We have also purchased a fully enclosed, tandem, braked trailer. This will be fully equipped with generator, compressor, 12v & 240v power, electric winch, alarm system, storage and spares. It will be an ongoing project no doubt. We entered Ben in the Auckland Car Club racing saloons on the 4th September. This was the first round of the club racing championship series, which we still aim to win this season. Unfortunately, on third lap of qualifying, a new front suspension bolt broke and the car lost the left front assy (wheel, hub, upright, axle, brake) as Ben came up the hill. He was pulling 8100rpm in 5th gear (210kph) and it spat the car into the concrete wall. A VERY BIG HIT.

Ben emerged from the wreckage with two dislodged ribs and two broken ribs, but no other injuries. Thank God. The scrutineers gave the car a good going over and were amazed at how strong it was. No deformation in the roll cage at all. The rest of the left front is pretty second-hand though, but we'll be back for next round in about 5 weeks on 16th October. The only consolation was that Ben's second lap had been about 5 seconds faster than the next fastest 1600cc qualifying time. We have plenty to do, but we'll be back. We will keep you informed.

Leslie Smith, 87, a Matchbox Car Creator, Dies

Leslie Smith, who for several decades after World War II was the world's largest automaker, at least in part because he made the world's smallest autos, died on May 26 at his home in North London. Mr. Smith, a founder, president and longtime chief executive of Matchbox Toys, was 87.

The cause was cancer, his son Andrew said.

Matchbox cars, which include everything from humble dump trucks to elegant Rolls-Royces, were introduced in 1953 and continue to be sold worldwide. Coveted, accumulated and passionately traded, they were a staple of childhood in the 1950's and after. They sold for 49 cents in the baby boomyears, and now cost about a dollar.

Known for their craftsmanship and realistic detail, the cars are also prized by collectors, with vintage models sometimes fetching thousands of dollars. A rare Matchbox Dodge wreck truck recently sold on eBay for more than \$9,000, Charlie Mack, the editor of Matchbox USA magazine, said in a telephone interview yesterday.

Designed to fit into a postwar-era British matchbox, the best-known Matchbox cars measure about three inches long. Mr. Smith's company, which began as a die-casting business, was by 1962 turning out 50 million cars a year - more, The New York Times reported, "than all of the world's major automobile producers combined." Matchbox Toys are now manufactured by Mattel.

Leslie Charles Smith was born in Enfield, in Middlesex County, England, on March 6, 1918. He left school at 14 and served with the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve in World War II, commanding a mine sweeper in European and North African waters.

In the navy, Mr. Smith was reunited with Rodney Smith, a boyhood friend. After the war, the two men, who were not related, scraped together #600 and set up shop as die casters in the East End of London. They called their company Lesney Products, an amalgam of their first names.

Not long after they were joined by Jack Odell, a friend of Rodney Smith.

As the story goes, Mr. Odell created Lesney's first toy, a small brass road roller, in 1952 as a gift for his young daughter, who quickly became the envy

of her schoolmates. In 1953, when Queen Elizabeth II took the throne, Lesney released a miniature version of her coronation coach. More than a million were sold.

The company's earliest miniature vehicles, the first to bear the Matchbox name, were marketed that year. Workaday affairs, they included a dump truck, a cement mixer and a road roller. An immediate success in Britain, the toys were introduced in the United States shortly afterward.

Lesney released its first miniature cars in the mid-1950's, starting with an MG Midget TD, which was followed by a Vauxhall Cresta and a Ford Zodiac.

To make the cars, Lesney designers regularly visited automakers, vintage-car museums and private collectors, photographing old and new models from every angle, taking exhaustive measurements, even obtaining blueprints. The result, scale models that were generally one-sixty-fourth the size of the real thing, were palm-size automotive microcosms, with wheels that turned and, in later years, doors, hoods and trunks that opened.

In 1956, Lesney introduced its Models of Yesteryear line, based on turn-of-the-

century vehicles. In 1969, facing competition from Mattel's Ho Wheels cars, the company introduced its Superfast line of toy autos.

In 1982, Lesney, then in bankruptcy, was sold to Universal Toys, which was later acquired by Tyco Toys. Tyco merged with Mattel in 1997.

Mr. Smith's wife, the former Nancy Jackson-Moore, died in 1969. Besides his son Andrew, of Hertfordshire, he is survived by another son, John, of Dorset; a daughter, Karen Brouard, of Kent; a sister, Mollie Rissbrook of Enfield; and nine grandchildren.

Mini Drive Day

I was lucky enough to get an early birthday present this year - a day at Pukekohe raceway driving a BMW Mini. Having spent a day working for Dave Handiside cleaning (and moving) these Minis, I was real keen to try them out and see how much better they would go than my Clubman.





The day began with each of the fifteen drivers being issued with a pair of racing overalls, racing boots and a helmet. All of the drivers were then briefed on the specifications of the Minis, how to drive the track, how to approach corners and what we would be doing over the course of the day. Each driver then chose a mini and climbed in. All of the minis are left hand drive, have a full roll cage, racing seats and a five point harness.



The track was divided into three sections, consisting of a slalom on the back straight, driving the hairpin and lastly, emergency stopping with ABS braking. All of the drivers were briefed again and some drivers were warned about speeding between sections. We were then split into two groups to practise driving lines through the esses and through the hairpin. The hairpin was not easy at speed and I soon found myself on the grass.





After lunch, we had a briefing on how to run a more complex slalom course on the front straight and then returned to the cars. My time for the slalom was a slow thirty six seconds for the heat and then thirty one seconds for our second attempt. The winning time for this slalom run was twenty eight and a half seconds. At the end of this event we did a follow -the -leader event around the track behind the instructor who was in a Mini Cooper S. This got progressively faster with speeds on the back straight going to a hundred and sixty five kilometers an hour. Following this, we did individual laps around the circuit where you were allowed to pass on the straights.

This brought the driving to an end and all of the drivers were then treated to some fast laps in two Mini Cooper S's driven by the instructors. During these laps we were getting lap times of less than 1.15 and on the back straight getting speeds of just under two hundred kilometers per hour. The day concluded with a de-brief from Murray Taylor - and a slow drive back to Auckland.

This was a great day and I would recommend it to anyone as a fun day out.

The Estate will directly accommodate the new dashboard that the MINI will receive. There is a facelift in the works for the MINI and MINI Cabriolet in which the new dashboard will make its debut. The materials used will be solidly upgraded and there is an expanded in-car entertainment system available.

Estate lives again!

This is not the first time that Mini has come out with a stationwagon. There was also an Estate model available on the old Mini. Several body structure enhancements are above all responsible for building the regular MINI into a 3-door stationwagon. In reality the new model will have to wait until 2007, but will eventually also be available as a 5-door stationwagon. Surprising is the development of the doors which can be opened in the opposite direction.
